ABSTRACT

This research work set out to ascertain the level of theft and mutilation of information materials in LAUTECH Medical Library Osogbo. It has been noticed that major problem facing the development of most special libraries is the consistent rising in the level of theft and mutilation of information materials causing a decline in the volume of the library collections. In order to successfully carry out this study, a survey research method was adopted, using questionnaires and observation as the major instruments for data collection aside from examining relevant documents/materials affected to collect necessary statistics about the library. Descriptive statistical method, which uses the simple percentage was used to analyze the data collected pie charts are also used for data presentation, thereby enabling for easy discussion and interpretation of data.
