



Table 1: Number of Questionnaires Distributed and Received Back








Figure 4: Often Visit to the Library.




Figure 6: Time Spent in Library.




Figure 7: Opinion on Sources for Preferred Reading.




Figure 8: Opinion on Services of Library.




Figure 9: Physical Facilities of the Library.
